
Florida Highway Post Offices


In Florida there were only four highway post offices.

Jacksonville and Pensacola H.P.O. actually operated between Jacksonville and Dothan, Ala. Roundtrip distance was 555.6 miles. It was established Febuary 9, 1957 and discontinued June 30, 1967.







The Tampa & Venice H.P.O. was established August 31, 1953, discontinued September 13, 1958.




Note: the first marking was Tampa & Venice R.P.O.



Orlando & Leesburg H.P.O. was established November 1, 1949, with a round trip of 124.9 miles. The operator was James V. Courtesy, Tavernes, Florida. It was discontinued July 11, 1958.




Orlando & Leesburg HPO Trip 1 (Courtesy of Deane Briggs)

The route was changed to Orlando & Ocala on July 12, 1958 and discontinued September 30, 1965.

The Albany, Georgia & Panama City, Florida H.P.O. was established on July 16, 1956. Northwest Florida saw its first Highway Post Office after the H.P.O. completed its 177-mile trip from Albany, Ga., to Panama City, Fl. It replaced service provided by the Central of George and the Bay Line railroads from Albany to Panama City.

The bus stopped at Campbellton, Cottondale, Alford, Fountain and Youngstown. The H.P.O. continued to be operated by the Central of Georgia with the railroad furnishing the vehicle and driver and the clerk on the H.P.O. was a postal transportation employee.
